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Summer Watering Tips

It's been a hot summer and the district's water usage has gone up as a result. The following tips can help reduce water usage at your home. In the Colorado Springs area, it is recommended that lawns be watered three (3) days per week during the summer months. This can vary depending on weather and soil conditions so it may be necessary to check the root zone peri-

odically using a spade or trowel. If the ground is still moist two inches under the soil surface, you probably have enough water. The following tips can also be used to ensure you are watering efficiently:


Adjust sprinklers to prevent water from spraying on non-landscaped areas including the sidewalk or street.

- Water in the morning or late evening when temperatures are cooler to minimize evaporation.
- If water runs off of your lawn easily, split your watering times into shorter periods to allow for better absorption.
- Try to avoid planting grass on sloped areas as water will run off quickly.
- Keep in mind that shaded or protected areas may need less water than other zones.
- You may want to adjust your lawn mower to the height of 1.5 to 2 inches. Taller grass shades roots and holds moisture better than short grass.

Water Efficient Landscaping

There are many water efficient plants that grow well in our climate. The Colorado Springs Utilities Conservation and Environmental Center, 2855 Mesa Road, provides many examples of Xeriscape landscaping options. They are open Monday through Friday, 8:00 am through 5 pm. You are also welcome to visit the garden in the evenings and weekends; however, staff are not available during these times.
